IN-HOME ENERGY ASSESSMENTS



IN-HOME ENERGY ASSESSMENT

- On the day of the In-Home Energy Assessment the Energy Assessor will conduct a Basic Assessment. This includes the replacement of incandescent lights with LED light bulbs, up to a maximum of 50; a programmable smart power bar and outdoor timer, if applicable.
- Houses that have an electric water heater may be eligible for hot water tank insulation wrap, pipe insulation, low flow showerheads and aerators.
- When restrictions have lifted due to COVID-19, home insulation assessments and insulations upgrades, for those that qualify, will continue if time allows us to do so.
- Helpful energy-saving tips
- Every home will receive no cost energy efficient product during the energy assessment





Basic Measures

On the day of the energy assessment, you will receive:

LED light bulbs*

Smart power bar**

Outdoor timer**

* Maximum cap

** 1 per approved household





If your home has an electric water heater, you qualify for:

Tank and pipe wrapping

Low Flow Kitchen/bath aerators

Low Flow Showerhead



OTHER TYPES OF ENERGY ASSESSMENTS

- **Extended Measures:** includes the replacement and disposal of older working appliances including a refrigerator, freezer, window air conditioner and portable dehumidifier, if applicable. If the approved homeowner has qualified to receive a new energy efficient appliance through the FNCP, we must remove the old appliance upon delivery. The old appliances are recycled by a certified company to ensure all steps are taken to protect the environment.
- **Weatherization Measures:** for electrically heated homes, programmable thermostats will be installed by a qualified electrician. Again, for electrically heated homes, based on a Total Resource Cost benefits analysis, Weatherization Measures may be installed including draft proofing, upgrades to attic, wall and basement insulation.



PREPARING FOR YOUR ASSESSMENT

- The Basic In-home Energy Assessment process normally takes between 30 to 45 minutes.
- **PREPARATION CHECKLIST:**
 - **Basements and Attics**
Clear any belongings and/or clutter to allow access to basement stairs as well as ladder access to attic hatches or to allow extension of drop down stairs.
 - **Knee wall, Crawlspace or other wall access hatches:**
Clear any belongings and/or clutter to allow access to open these.
 - **Safety:**
Please monitor small children and secure all pets.

If you do not want the assessment team to access a certain part of your home please let them know.



HEALTH AND SAFETY

DUE TO THE PANDEMIC

We want to remind all our homeowners again, that we will take the following precautions when entering your home. The FNCP wants to protect our homeowners along with our assessment crews.



- All individuals entering the home will be required to wear Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) which would include: masks, face shield and gloves.



- All areas of the home that will be touched by the assessment crew will be sanitized upon entry and exit.



- All PPE will be changed after exiting each home and disposed of properly off-site
- When a signature is required by the homeowner, the tablet and pen will be sanitized before and after.
